COMMENTS:

I'm writing to express my opinion and concern over the Canada-EU Trade Agreement. I understand a motion will be coming before council to request that the Province of Saskatchewan exclude municipalities such as Saskatoon from the CETA agreement.

I fully support the motion. The City of Saskatoon needs to look after the local and municipal concerns of the city and its citizens. The City is best able to do this by supporting local business. It needs to maintain an active role in identifying and determining its own needs and priorities and the direction of its own development. My understanding is that the CETA agreement would open Saskatoon's business to international bids and to corporations which may have little awareness or interest in local needs. It may also open the door to issues around liability.

Saskatoon's City Council needs to be active in determining the direction of its own development as the city continues to expand. Saskatoon is currently benefiting from economic growth. City Council needs to think of long-term consequences of losing control over determining the direction of its economic growth.

The city is blessed with a beautiful river, but the resource is fragile. With the changing climate and the diminishing glaciers in the Rockies, the Saskatchewan River may become limited resource. Water services should be excluded from the CETA agreement. We need to protect this essential resource rather than accept short-term profits for international interests.

I ask you to join other Canadian cities and to vote for the motion excluding Saskatoon from CETA on February 6.
