PUBLIC NOTICE

INTENT TO BORROW

City Council will be considering a report from the Administration at a City Council meeting to be held on **Wednesday, February 28, 2024, at 6:00 p.m.**, hosted in the Council Chamber, Saskatoon City Hall, recommending:

That the planned borrowing to finance the following projects be approved, in principle, through capital budgets and capital plans:

- Up to \$23,500,000 for the Transit Replacement Bus Project (Capital Project P.00583);
- Up to \$23,076,000 for the Transit Implementation Plan (Capital Project P.02328);
- Up to \$8,028,000 for the Wastewater Biosolids Forcemain (Capital Project P.02592);
- Up to \$6,618,000 for the New Fire Stations and Upgrades Project (Capital Project P.10074);
- Up to \$5,000,000 for the Landfill Optimization (Capital Project P.02051);
- Up to \$2,000,000 for the Indoor Recreation Facilities Project (Capital Project P.02600);
- Up to \$1,282,000 for the Corp Fuel and Fueling Infrastructure Management Project (Capital Project P.10076); and
- An allowable 10% variance on the borrowing requirements for each project identified. Any variance greater than 10% of the borrowing amount identified must be reported to City Council.

The Cities Act and Bylaw No. 8171, Public Notice Policy Bylaw, 2003, require that Public Notice be given before borrowing money, lending money or guaranteeing the repayment of a loan. Some of the projects listed above may have already had approved borrowings from previous Public Notice Hearings. The recommendations above restate the full borrowing amount for each project.
