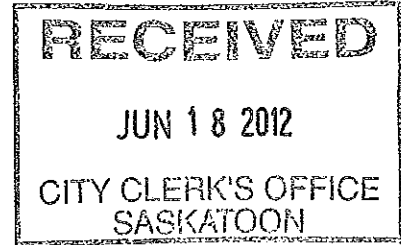

I am writing on behalf of the Lakeridge Community Association. I have spoken directly with several residents who are strongly opposed to the proposed changes to the Rosewood subdivision. The Community Association voiced its concerns several years ago when Rosewood first came to the planning stages. We opposed similar type dwellings at that time along with the proposed development of commercial properties at the corner of Kingsmere Blvd & Boychuck Dr.

Councillor Paulsen reminded me of a meeting that was held in early September & only 3 people attended. Perhaps the problem was that like myself I received the notice for this meeting "1" day prior to the meeting date, and it fell on the same date as our community fall registration. This date is very important to the Community Association as it is the biggest registration of the year. I voiced my concerns at that time to Art Lorde our community liason, as our registration night falls on the the same night every year (The first Tuesday & Wednesday after the September long weekend) Perhaps that is why only "3" people showed up as we have 200 & 300 people show up at registration night.

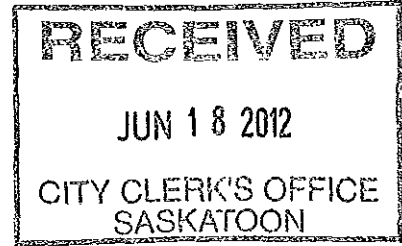

It will promote similar applications for other parcels in the neighborhood which could drastically decrease the value of my property and add to the problems that I have mentioned above.

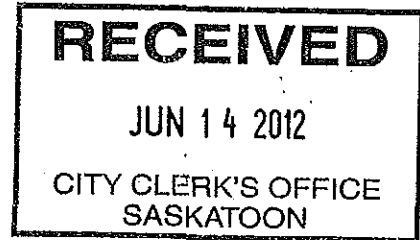

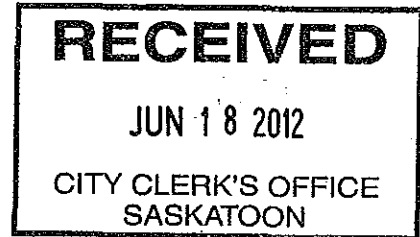
In conclusion I would hope that council members take this matter very seriously and keep the wellbeing of city members in mind.

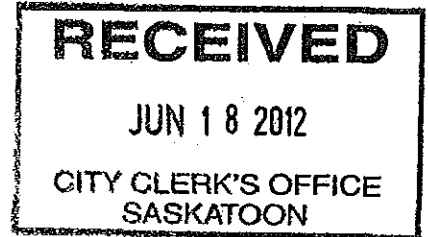

I am writing you regarding city by law #5469 that relates to changing meat inspection requirements for meat sold within the City of Saskatoon. I understand that you are going to discuss this bylaw at the Council meeting on June 18, 2012 and that the City Solicitor is recommending that you rescind this bylaw.

I am a small scale poultry farmer and the owner of a small, provincially inspected poultry processing plant just north of Saskatoon called Pine View Farms. I have farmed all my life and over the past 14 years, have built our farm-direct meat business through incremental growth and renovations to meet provincial meat inspection standards. You may learn more about our farm at [www.pineviewfarms.com](http://www.pineviewfarms.com). I would like to provide some information regarding this bylaw and offer an alternative to rescinding Bylaw # 5469 at this time.

The bylaw itself is worded in a manner that was more appropriate for an earlier time. The crux of it is that only meat from animals that have had post mortem and ante mortem inspection are allowed to be sold in the City of Saskatoon. This requires that meat be processed in provincially or federally inspected plants as they mandate third party inspectors examining each carcass during slaughter and auditing plant processes and protocols throughout the plant.

Currently, Health Board inspection does not require carcass inspection nor ongoing audits of slaughter processes, but only examines facilities periodically to see if they comply with Health Board regulations.

Health Board inspection serves the smaller plants across the province who primarily do custom slaughter for individuals i.e. the meat is not for resale. Health Board inspection serves these businesses well in this instance as the meat is not for the general public, but for individuals who feel comfortable using that plant for custom slaughter.

However, when serving the larger, general public market, I believe that carcass inspection during slaughter is important to ensure the health and safety of the general public by providing third party inspection for disease, proper specific risk material removal and disposal (required to minimize risk of BSE from beef animals over 30 months of age), fecal contamination, disposal of offal, proper chilling and freezing temperatures, cleaning and

disinfecting protocols, and many other situations that need monitoring. In fact, when food safety tops the survey list for many consumers, this inspection becomes even more important.

Moreover, as a meat processor, third party inspection reduces my business risk and liability while also providing assurance to the public that what they are buying has been examined and approved by someone other than me i.e. someone with no vested interest in my business.

By rescinding this law, in effect, there will be no inspection of carcasses for disease or contamination and it will become a "buyer beware" market in the City of Saskatoon. Unless the customer has seen the butcher shop and meat processing process themselves, they have no assurance that the meat has been handled in a safe manner. And most consumers do not have adequate knowledge of meat slaughter to make an informed decision.

I am currently part of a group of provincially inspected processors that is working with the Government of Saskatchewan to put together common meat processing guidelines for the province. We believe that food safety and meat inspection in particular, should be a jurisdiction of the Province, as it is in most provinces across Canada.

Therefore, I encourage you to keep this bylaw in place until the Province has created a Meat Act and to lobby the province to make meat inspection a provincial jurisdiction in an expeditious manner. This does not negate or eliminate Health Board inspection but will rather provide clarity and consistency for consumers across the province..

- RECOMMENDATION:**
- 1) that the Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) between the City and Cosmopolitan Industries Ltd. (“Cosmo”) with respect to Multi-Unit Dwellings (“MUD”) recycling be approved; and
  - 2) that His Worship the Mayor and the City Clerk be authorized to execute the MOU under the Corporate Seal.

At its meeting on May 28, 2012 City Council resolved, in part:

- “1) that the Administration be instructed to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding with Cosmopolitan Industries (Cosmo) in accordance with the general principles of Option #1 from the Administrative Report;”

Attached please find a MOU with Cosmo. This MOU sets out the intention of the parties to negotiate an Agreement for the provision of a MUD recycling program by Cosmo.

The MOU sets out the following principles upon which the Agreement will be negotiated:

1. The curbside recycling program for MUD’s will be a source-separated, multi-stream recycling program that will require all MUD’s to pay and accept bins.
2. The curbside recycling program will include options with respect to how the service will be provided.
3. Cosmo will be responsible for the customer call centre, collection and processing of recyclables.
4. MUD’s with current recycling contracts will be given a period of time, which is yet to be decided by City Council, to join the City’s program.

5. The terms of the Agreement will be generally based on the Agreement for single-family residential curbside recycling.
6. The length of the Agreement must be based on a commercially reasonable business plan and agreed by the parties.
7. Cosmo must undertake public community consultations prior to implementation of the MUD recycling program.

The MOU states that the parties will commence negotiations with the intention of having an Agreement in place by no later than January 1, 2014. The MOU also clearly states that any Agreement negotiated is subject to Council approval which includes budget approval of the MUD recycling program.

The City Manager and the General Manager of Utility Services have reviewed the MOU and are in an agreement with its terms. Cosmo has also reviewed the MOU, and has expressed to our Office their approval.

## Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum bearing effective date of \_\_\_\_\_, 2012.

Between:

**The City of Saskatoon**, a municipal corporation pursuant to the provisions of *The Cities Act*, S.S. 2002, Chapter C-11.1 (the "City")

and

**Cosmopolitan Industries Ltd.**, a non-profit charitable corporation with a registered office in the City of Saskatoon, in the Province of Saskatchewan ("Cosmo")

(collectively referred to as the "Parties")

### Whereas:

- A. The City intends to create a curbside recycling program for multi-unit dwellings ("MUD's").
- B. Cosmo has supported individuals with intellectual disabilities by providing recycling services in the City of Saskatoon for several decades.
- C. The City wishes to encourage the work of Cosmo in the provision of vocational opportunities for individuals with intellectual disabilities.
- D. Cosmo wishes to obtain the contract for curbside MUD recycling in the City of Saskatoon to allow it to continue and grow its program of providing vocational opportunities for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

Therefore, the City and Cosmo express their common understanding as follows:

### Purpose of Memorandum

1. The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to confirm the commitment by the City and Cosmo to negotiate an agreement (the "Agreement") for the provision of curbside recycling for MUD's and to provide a framework for those negotiations.

## **Principles and Objectives**

2. The negotiations between the Parties and the Agreement resulting from those negotiations will recognize and contain the following principles and objectives:
  - (a) the curbside recycling program for MUD's will be a source-separated, multi-stream recycling program that will apply to all MUD's in the City of Saskatoon. Payment and receipt of bins will be mandatory for MUD's as part of the program;
  - (b) the curbside recycling program for MUD's will include options with respect to how the service will be provided in order to accommodate the physical limitations of individual MUD sites;
  - (c) Cosmo will be responsible for the customer call centre and collection and processing of recyclables from the MUD recycling program similar to the services being provided by Loraas Recycle under the single-family residential curbside recycling program;
  - (d) MUD's with current recycling contracts will be given a period of time, which is yet to be decided by City Council, before being required to join the City's MUD recycling program;
  - (e) the terms of the Agreement will generally be based on the terms of the Agreement between the City and Loraas Recycle for the single-family residential curbside recycling program;
  - (f) the length of the Agreement will be as agreed to by the Parties but must be based on a commercially reasonable business plan; and
  - (g) Cosmo must undertake public community consultations prior to implementation of a MUD recycling program.

## **Time Frame**

3. The Parties will commence negotiations of the Agreement with the intention of having an Agreement in place by no later than January 1, 2014.



**Agreement Subject to City Council Approval**

4. Any Agreement negotiated by the Parties is subject to Council approval which includes budget approval of the MUD recycling program.

#### **B6) Provincial Disaster Assistance Program (File No. CK. 1860-1)**

**RECOMMENDATION:** that The City of Saskatoon apply to the Ministry of Corrections, Public Safety and Policing to be designated an Eligible Assistance Area under the Provincial Disaster Assistance Program (PDAP) which provides financial assistance for restoring essential services and property as a result of substantial damages caused by excessive rain, commencing approximately June 9, 2012.

The City is beginning to receive calls from private property owners who have experienced property damage as a result of flooding caused by excessive amounts of rain. To date, Public works has received approximately 35 calls, City Clerk's has had around 5-10, our Office has had 4 calls, and the PDAP program advised they have received around 5. The Province of Saskatchewan has a Provincial Disaster Assistance Program which covers uninsurable damage to individual properties caused by a natural disaster. It is our understanding that flooding caused by excessive amounts of rain would qualify. The minimum criteria for a declaration is one claim of \$5,000 or several smaller claims totalling \$30,000. We believe we have met those requirements.

In order for individual citizens to receive assistance under the PDAP, City Council must request, by resolution, that the City be designated an Eligible Assistance Area. Once the City is designated, we will arrange for the distribution of Provincial application forms. The Province will then arrange for the claims to be adjusted and make payments where appropriate.

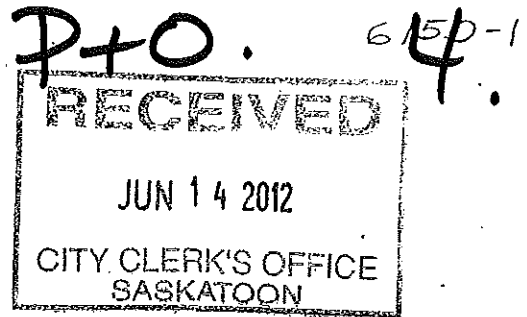

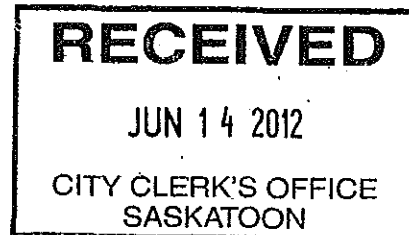
