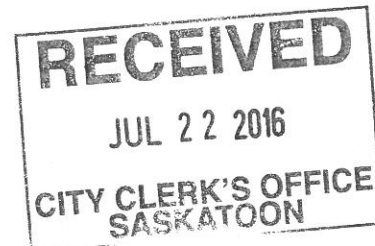

I can't tell you how disturbed I am with the traffic enforcement I encountered this morning in downtown Saskatoon. It's been two years since I've been downtown and being from out of town I was totally unaware of the prohibition of a right hand turn on a red light on 4th avenue. After being waved in by an officer I was advised of the prohibition and shown the obscure sign well above the red light. The officer was professional however I can't help but think this has way more to do with a cash grab by the city than it has to do with cyclist safety. As I sat and waited for my offence notice, I counted 12 other vehicles that made the same right hand turn on the red light that I had done. I'm not complaining that they weren't ticketed but it certainly told me that this was a poorly advertised change to traffic regulation in the city. I feel sorry for the constable who was ordered to enforce this bylaw as I'm sure he must have taken a great deal of abuse during this shift. The city should be ashamed of putting good young staff in situations that rile supporters of law enforcement efforts and are only looking for revenue

I know the legal system and will be paying my fine but certainly will remember the event on future trips to the city

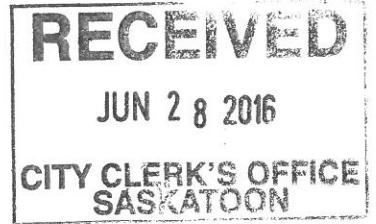

Hi Zach

Thank you very much for your ongoing follow up. I have an important request from you and the City of Saskatoon that may require some investigation. I look forward to the feedback from all resources.

As a tax payer in Saskatoon, I do understand that the majority of a tax dollar goes towards policing. I do not have my most recent brochure, but lets say 43 cents or so of each dollar. As a citizen who lives in Evergreen, I would like you to find out how often policing actually occurs within the boundaries of what is known as "Evergreen". I do not want statistics for patrolling on the " east side", but specific statistics for proactive patrolling within the streets of Evergreen. Not....the perimeter. I do not want to know how many complaints they have responded to. I want to know the numbers for simple proactive patrolling. I think these vehicles are equipped with GPS or the police officers mobile phones may have it and hence the statistics should be available to the hard tax paying citizens. I welcome this information if it directly comes from the Saskatoon City Police.

I can tell you that my experience living in Evergreen and actually seeing policing within Evergreen is very limited. And please, I do not want to hear from SPD that we tend to do more policing in our higher crime areas and that may not mean the Evergreen area. Nope, I will not hear of that. I want to know what my 43 cents or so of each tax paying dollar goes to for the area that I reside in.

I am tired of living in an area where the SPD is virtually obsolete with proactive patrolling within the streets of Evergreen. I am tired in waking up Saturday and Sunday mornings with alcohol bottles and cans thrown out in the streets. I am tired of waking up and finding condoms on the sidewalks or streets as people choose to drive out to less populated communities for their sexual rendezvous. I am tired of citizens driving out at night and using the empty lots in my community as their city dump. I am tired of driving/walking in a neighborhood with inconsiderate developers/tradesmen who choose to violate almost every traffic rule and then choose to smoke up on their job sites (still illegal).

What am I most tired of? The SPD with their ongoing cash grab by setting up constant speed traps on Lowe Road and McOrmond Drive. The SPD knows what the perimeter roads of Evergreen look like, but can they actually name 5 streets within Evergreen? I am very, very supportive of speed limit enforcement. BUT, I am only supportive of speed limit enforcement when its intended purpose achieves its goal. The goal of speed limit enforcement in any police jurisdiction is to improve safety, to protect lives, to reduce traffic injuries and deaths. Can you please provide me from the SPD with the actual annual statistics for the traffic injuries/accidents/deaths that have occurred on McOrmond Drive from Nelson Road/Addison Road or Stensrud Road to Evergreen Boulevard? How many traffic injuries/accidents/deaths have occurred on McOrmond Drive in the last year in this area? Two years? Five year average? The same for Lowe Road from the traffic round about on Evergreen Boulevard to Nelson Road?

I can probably safely say that these numbers are very low. So, can the SPD then explain to me as a tax paying citizen their need to have a speed trap in this area 3 times in the past 6 or so days? What safety statistics are they trying to improve? Can they please share them with me/the public?

Truthfully, I see this as nothing more as a cash grab and it sickens me. I want the SPD to prove me wrong as apparently they feel this stretch of road has had numerous violent accidents causing injury and death. They somehow statistically can prove they are improving safety and as a tax payer we deserve to know this. Do you know that some countries actually hold police departments accountable when their speed limit enforcements are nothing, but cash grabs?

And no Zach, I did not get a speeding ticket nor plan on to. I am just sick and tired that the only time I see the SPD is near Evergreen on McOrmond and Lowe Road with speed traps. It is a true shame that I never see a proactive patrol in my neighborhood to make my community safer and to know that a majority of my tax dollar is being properly spent.

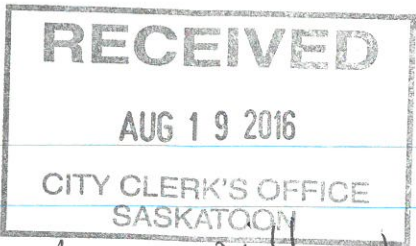
I really want feedback on this issue. It has been ongoing since I have moved into this area. I use to see patrol cars in Beuna Vista all the time and they were not out just enforcing speed limits at Beuna Vista school where it mattered. They actually policed my neighborhood.

As my city representative, I really hope you recognize this alarming concern. I am so frustrated watching the SPD hide behind bushes, stand on hills and enforce speed where there is very limited need to improve safety. There is a far better job that can be done with policing not only in Evergreen, but other areas where improving safety would actually matter.

I welcome feedback from the SPD and from the City of Saskatoon. I would love to hear back from the Mayor on this as well. We, the tax payers deserve answers from a City who allows this to happen. This is not how tax dollars should be spent. This is not effective policing. I will not support a Mayor or council that allow this to happen.

Re: Saskatchewan Police Commission – Conflict of Interest Policy

Thank you for your letter dated May 5, 2015. The Regina Board of Police Commissioners considered your correspondence at its May 25, 2016 meeting. After considerable discussion, and deliberation, at this time the Regina Board of Police Commissioners will not be sending correspondence to support police foundations being added to the Conflict of Interest Policy. It is our collective view that it is an inherent conflict of interest to have foundations attached to police services. We support the view of the Saskatchewan Police Commission, in that regard.

The Regina Board of Police Commissioners is not interested in having a foundation attached to the Regina Police Service. Of major concern is the independence and integrity of police services being compromised by a foundation, and the potential for undue influence by donors. Funding of police services is the statutory obligation of the government, both municipal and provincial. It is our concern that foundations could indirectly result in less money being earmarked for policing. Furthermore, accountability and transparency in funding for police is important. Elected officials, and members of the Board of Police Commissioners, are accountable to the public in a way that a foundation could never be.

While our position is no doubt disappointing, I trust it is understood.

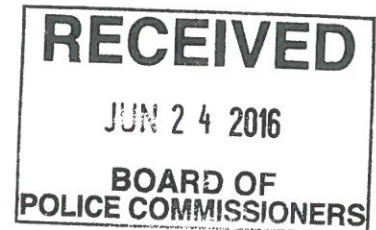

Re: Conflict of Interest Policy

The current draft of the policy is intended to remove conflicts of interest that can occur when an obligation appears to be attached to a funding source. There is no room in policing for favoritism or bias and the policy will help maintain credibility, public support and professionalism. At the request of the Saskatoon Board of Police Commissioners we would like to add our support for the inclusion of foundations as an acceptable funding mechanism for Saskatchewan police.

A foundation places the Service at arms- length from donations and can limit the exposure provided to the donor. If proper guidelines are provided around fundraising, advertising, and governance the foundation should not interfere with the delivery of policing services.

While it is unlikely that our Board will utilize a foundation as a funding methodology we are not opposed to other Boards doing so.

A 43-year-old Battleford man is facing a number of charges following an incident where a driver refused to stop for police.

At approximately 2:30 a.m., May 30, 2016, a member of the Canine Unit witnessed a male motorist shouting at a female pedestrian at 20th Street and Avenue G South. The officer found that the white GMC half-ton truck was registered to a man who was prohibited from driving, Canada-wide. The vehicle refused to stop and evaded the officer by driving in the wrong direction on 22nd Street at excessive speeds. Just minutes later the officer located the truck, abandoned behind an apartment building on Avenue N South. Police Service Dog Tyr located the suspect hiding nearby. The suspect was taken into custody and treated for minor injuries consistent with dog bites.

Inside the vehicle officers located many grocery and electronic items which had been stolen on May 29th from a department store.

The 43-year-old Battleford man is now facing charges of Dangerous Operation of a Motor Vehicle, Evade Police, Driving While Disqualified and Theft Under \$5000. He is expected to appear in court today.

I am advised by the Incident Commander that on May 13, 2016 at 0430 hours, RCMP and SPS Critical Incident Command executed a High Risk Search Warrant at a Rural Saskatoon residence (conducted at 0600 hours). In preparation of this, the Team Leaders (SPS Sgt. Ken Kane) met and completed a reconnaissance in the rural area to ensure maximal use of resources. Insp. Vols provided incident command presence during the planning stages and during the execution of the plan. During the execution of the warrant, SPS deployed Snipers, Medics, ERT Assaulters, and provided access to the Armoured Vehicle and Air Services. This demonstrated our teams interoperability to achieve a common goal, which clearly highlighted the value of having exercised together and resolved issues such as common language, communications, and joint use of resources.

As a result of this highly successful search, four subjects were taken into custody without injury or damage to public, police or the subjects. One individual, the primary suspect in this investigation, has been charged with approximately sixteen counts; following the execution of a search warrant which netted approximately \$100,000.00 worth of stolen property, weapons, including a prohibited shotgun and taser.

I wanted to express my appreciation of the Saskatoon Police Services during this event and acknowledge the excellent effort put forth by your members.

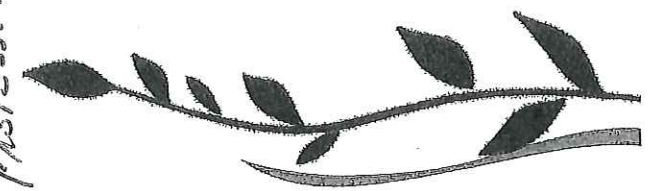
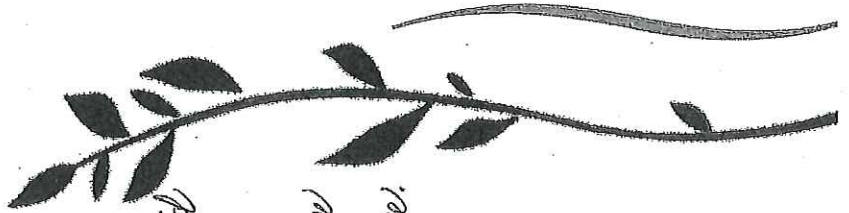


In some cases, it is impossible to guess what neighbourhood the incident took place in. For example, "1 Block St E" or "1 Block St W & Ave D S". (Perhaps some confusion on entering blocks in the alphabet streets?) Otherwise, you've got a great app here. It beat the news for me already in at least one case.



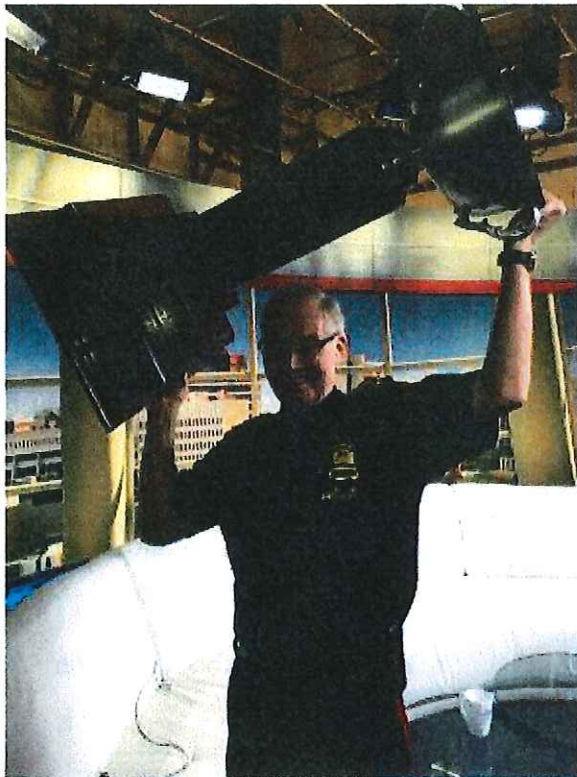

I am currently a director with the Ontario Tactical Advisory Body (OTAB), and a Sergeant with the York Regional Police Service, Emergency Response Unit / Explosive Disposal Unit. We are a full time hostage rescue team, with 25 members.

I was extremely impressed with the presentation Constable Beerling and Sergeant Kane delivered to our attendees. FILE #: 2,014

ISSUE:

Lost time injury frequency has been trending upward over the past five years. Even though there was a reduction in 2015, the Saskatoon Police Service is committed to reducing work related injuries and illnesses and has a number of action plans in place to achieve this goal.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the information be received.

BACKGROUND:

At the City Council meeting held on June 27, 2016, a recommendation contained in the report of the Standing Policy Committee on Environment, Utilities and Corporate Services stated “that the Board of Police Commissioners be required to provide additional information on its action plans to reduce lost time injury and frequency.”

A re-cap of the statistics for the Saskatoon Police Service is provided by Dustin Truscott, Manager of Occupational Health and Safety.

In 2015, Police Services lost-time injury frequency reporting was 4.67, a twenty-five percent decrease from the 2014 reported lost-time injury frequency of 6.20.

Police Services medical aid injuries decreased by 6% (those injuries that require medical attention but do not result in time away from work).

The Lost Time Injury Frequency (LTIF) is calculated by multiplying the number of lost-time injuries by 200,000 and then dividing that by the employee labour hours (exposure hours).

$$\text{LTIF} = \frac{\text{Number of Lost Time Injuries} \times 200,000}{\text{Number of Employee Labour Hours Worked}}$$

Trends

- Saskatoon Police observed a 25% reduction in lost-time injuries in 2015.
- Saskatoon Police saw a reduction in medical aid injuries (6%) in 2015.
- There was a decrease in injury severity by 36% at the Saskatoon Police Service.

CHART 1: LOST TIME INJURY FREQUENCY BY POLICE (LTIF) (2011 TO 2015)

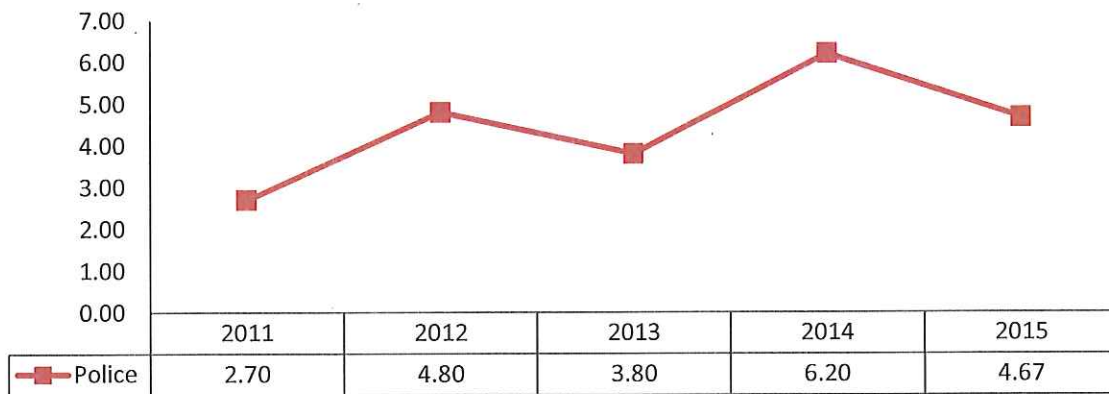
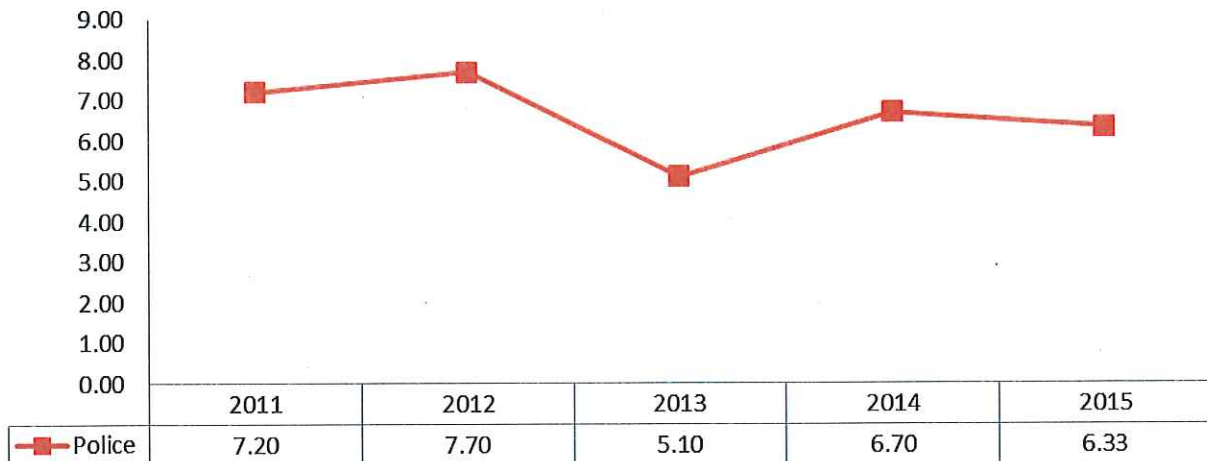


Chart 1 presents the LTIF for the Police Services. Despite an excellent performance in 2015 from 2014, the Saskatoon Police Service has been trending upward over the last five years.

Chart 2 shows that Saskatoon Police Service medical aid frequency decreased last year (2014-2015) and has been experiencing downward trend in medical aid frequency over the last five years.

CHART 2: MEDICAL AID FREQUENCY FOR POLICE SERVICES (2011 TO 2015)



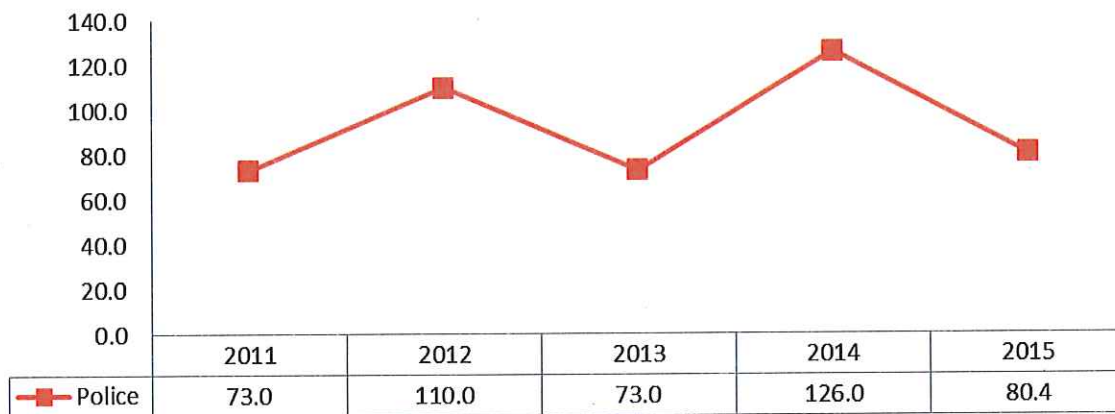

Medical Aid Frequency is a standard that is used to measure the number of injuries that required medical attention, but did not result in lost time. This calculation uses a similar formula as LTIF.

$$\text{MAF} = \frac{\text{Number of Medical Aid Injuries} \times 200,000}{\text{Number of Employee Labour Hours Worked}}$$

Medical Aid Frequency is a measure of the number of medical aid injuries per 100 employees.

CHART 3: SEVERITY OF INJURY BY POLICE SERVICES (2011 TO 2015)



Injury Severity is calculated by multiplying the number of lost-time days by 200,000 and then dividing that by the employee labour hours (exposure hours). This is a standardized calculation that expresses loss as a representation of days lost per 100 employees.

$$\text{Injury Severity} = \frac{\text{Number of Lost Time Days} \times 200,000}{\text{Number of Employee Labour Hours Worked}}$$

Chart 3 data shows a reduction in injury severity for Saskatoon Police Service in 2015. Saskatoon Police Service injury severity has increased over the last five years despite a reduction from 2014.

CHART 4: LOST TIME DAYS BY POLICE SERVICES (2011 TO 2015)

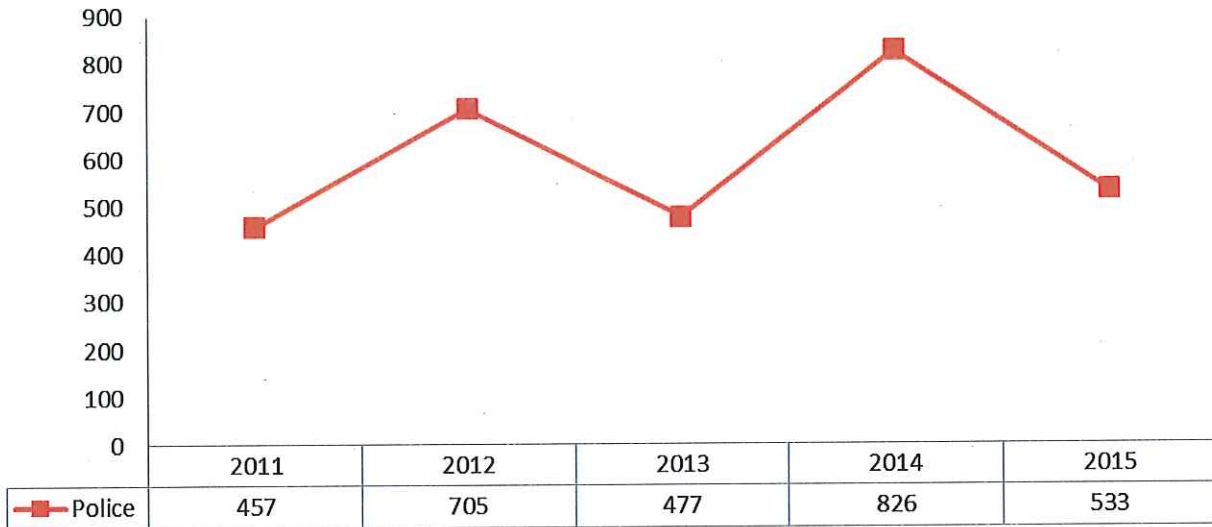
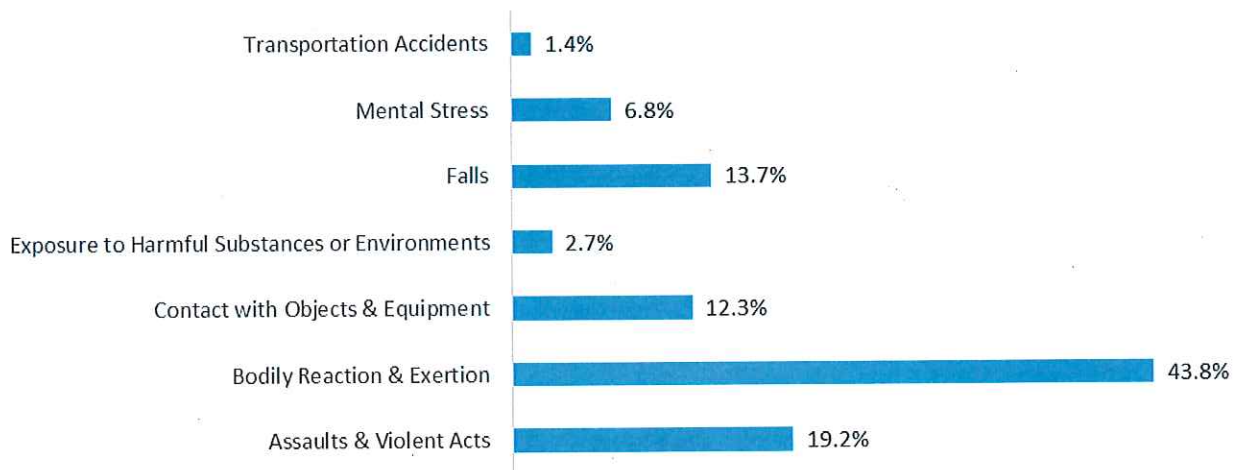


Chart 4 demonstrates a decrease in lost time days in 2015 from 2014. The data also shows an upward trend in lost time days from 2011-2015.

Injury Trends

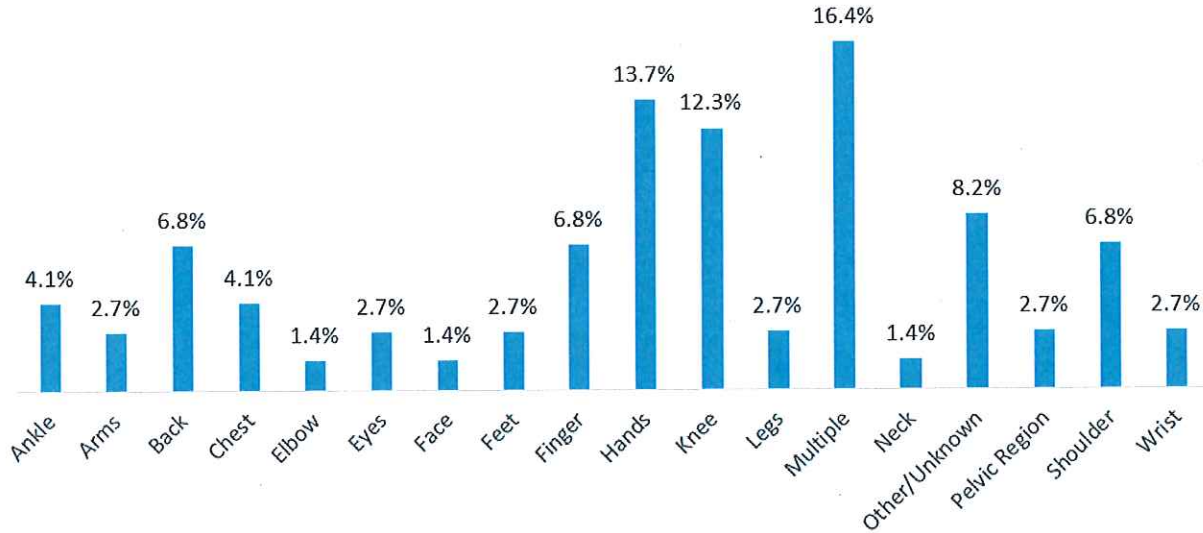
This data represents 73 injuries that resulted in medical treatment (medical-aid or lost-time).

CHART 5: INJURY BY WCB CATEGORY, POLICE SERVICE 2015



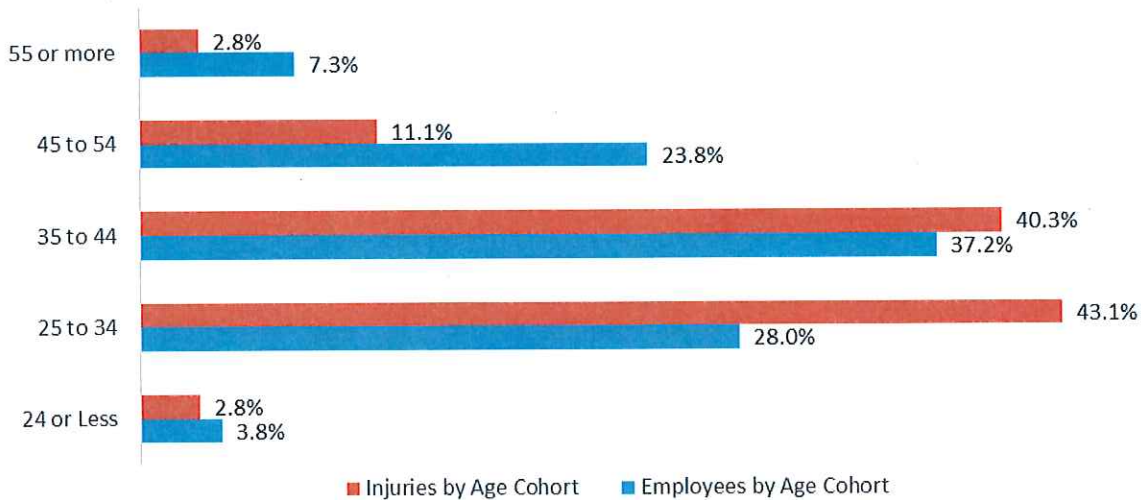
Thirty-two (32) were reported due to over-exertion or a bodily reaction to the activity.

As is evident from Chart 6, injuries were distributed over a number of body areas.

CHART 7: PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL INJURIES BY AGE COHORT, 2015



The less than 24 age cohort represents 3.8% of the employee population and accounts for 2.8% of the injuries. The 25-34 cohort represents 28.0% of the employee population and 43.1% of injuries. The 35-44 cohort represents 37.2% of the employee population and 40.3% of injuries. The 45-54 age cohort represents 23.8% of the employee population and accounts for 11.1% of workplace injuries. Finally, the 55+ cohort represents 7.3% of the employee population and accounts for 2.8% of injuries.

DISCUSSION:

In 2014, the Saskatoon Police Service and the City of Saskatoon joined the Priority Employer Improvement Program with the Occupational Health and Safety Division of the Ministry of Labour Relations and Workplace Safety. An improvement plan was formalized with the Ministry and quarterly progress reports provided, demonstrating the Service's commitment to mitigating work related injuries and illnesses. A number of goals and action plans have been put in place to reduce the number of work related injuries and illnesses.

Goal 1: A reduction of psychological injuries

Mandatory Psychological Testing

A top priority for the Human Resources Division is to develop a policy for yearly mandatory psychological testing for members that are in high risk/exceptionally mentally disturbing jobs such as Internet Child Exploitation, Child Abuse, Sex Crimes, Identification, Homicide, etc. The Service has made it a priority to deal with mental health in a proactive manner and prevent members from going off work with psychological injuries. The Service has formed a joint Association/Management committee to address this issue and to develop policy requiring members in certain high risk positions undergo yearly psychological assessments. During the first half of the year, a number of meetings have taken place between the Association and Management and the policy is in draft form and has been sent to the Deputy Chiefs for review.

Educate members on the Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and how to recognize signs of other mental health issues

The SPS partnered with the Prince Albert Police Service to bring the Road to Mental Readiness Instructor program to the Service. The course was scheduled for June 13 to 17, 2016 and two thirds of the cost was covered by a provincial grant. There were 12 SPS employees trained to be instructors. Four of the instructors were civilians with the intent on delivering this training to civilian employees as well. A number of our civilian members are exposed to very disturbing information, having to type graphic reports, investigations and transcripts. Once our instructors are trained we plan to deliver the training to all employees in 2017 and 2018.

In October 2015, the SPS sent 17 members to a two-day Wellness Conference in Moose Jaw. The Annual Wellness Conference is being hosted in Saskatoon this October. With this being a local event, it is hoped that even more members will be able to attend. The Saskatchewan Federation of Police Officers is hosting this year's conference and a number of the speakers will speak on maintaining mental wellness in a very challenging environment.

Provide training on mental health

Two SPS Constables have trained 74 employees in Mental Health First Aid. This course helps our members recognize signs and symptoms of a fellow member suffering with mental health challenges. More courses are anticipated in the upcoming months and the training is well-received.

An SPS Sergeant and leader on the Critical Incident Stress Management Team (CISM), has been providing training on parades and to Special Teams such as the Tactical Support Unit and Crisis

Negotiators on recognizing the signs and symptoms of traumatic stress and cumulative stress. She has also been facilitating training offered to all employees and family members on topics related to mental health including mindfulness training, children and anxiety, caregiver issues and resiliency. She also advised that the CISM team has been responding to traumatic events involving our members with increased frequency. The CISM Policy and Procedures have been recently updated and after any major event there is a debrief held with members involved. These debriefs allow the members a chance to talk about what happened to colleagues in a safe environment.

Goal 2: A reduction of injuries caused in the fitness center

Develop an employee wellness plan to ensure employees have access to a specialist for physical fitness programs.

With the move to our new Headquarters building there was a spike in the number of injuries that occurred in the weight room and the gymnasium. The Service hired a part time Wellness Coordinator to assist our members with proper fitness, workout routines and nutrition. This new Wellness Coordinator provides advice and expertise to our membership that will reduce the number of injuries due to strains and over exertion in the gym. He is also providing specific work out plans for members on the Tactical Support Unit and specialized training plans for those applying to work in the Canine Unit. Since November, the Coordinator has personally assisted 205 SPS members (147 sworn and 58 civilian) by implementing various small group and individual fitness initiatives. A proposal has been made to make the position permanent full-time.

Goal 3: A reduction of injuries in the parkade due to the slippery surface

In the winter of 2015 and 2016 there were a number of injuries caused by the slippery surface on the parkade. The parkade is being re-surfaced and the related number of slips and falls is anticipated to be reduced throughout winter months.

Goal 4: A reduction of injuries during mandatory training courses

A review of mandatory Defensive Tactics training course has taken place to determine if any of the scenarios can be delivered in a safer manner. A number of members were getting injured during the warm up exercises for Defensive Tactics and so those activities have been modified. The Instructors have been reminded to consider each participant's fitness level during the training and a concerted effort has been taken to match members with partners at similar physical fitness levels. There has been a 54% decrease in injuries related to Defensive Tactics Training from 2012 to 2014 since the safety audit of this program has taken place.

Goal 5: A reduction of injuries related to hearing loss

A review was completed of hearing protection utilized during annual firearms training. In 2016, the Service implemented annual hearing testing for all Firearms Instructors and is investigating the purchase of custom-fitted ear plugs for instructors to wear under the regular hearing protection. The range masters continue to be vigilant about members wearing proper hearing protection during annual firearms training.

Goal 6: A reduction of back injuries caused from the weight of the duty belt

The Equipment Committee is currently researching a load bearing vest which would assist some members that are suffering from back pain caused by the weight of all of the equipment on their duty belts. This vest has provisions to carry non use of force items such as hand cuffs, flash lights, etc. on the vest and takes some of the weight off of the duty belt. There is currently a pilot project underway to evaluate the functionality of the vests and the Occupational Health and Safety Committee and the Equipment Committee will review the outcome of the pilot project. If a member submits appropriate medical documentation they could be issued a load bearing vest.

Goal 7: Continued review of operational injuries

A number of injuries to members in Patrol are caused by arresting and apprehending suspects. Even though some injuries are unavoidable due to the nature of police work, each investigation report is reviewed by the injured member’s supervisor and feedback is provided to the member. Corrective action is noted on investigation reports if there is anything that could have been done to avoid or prevent injury.

Goal 8: Networking with other law enforcement agencies to determine best practices

In 2016, SPS will be participating in periodic teleconferences with a network of other Occupational Health and Safety practitioners from Western Canada to establish Common best practices. Workplace accommodation, equipment issues and employee wellness are some of the topics that will be explored.

CONCLUSION:


