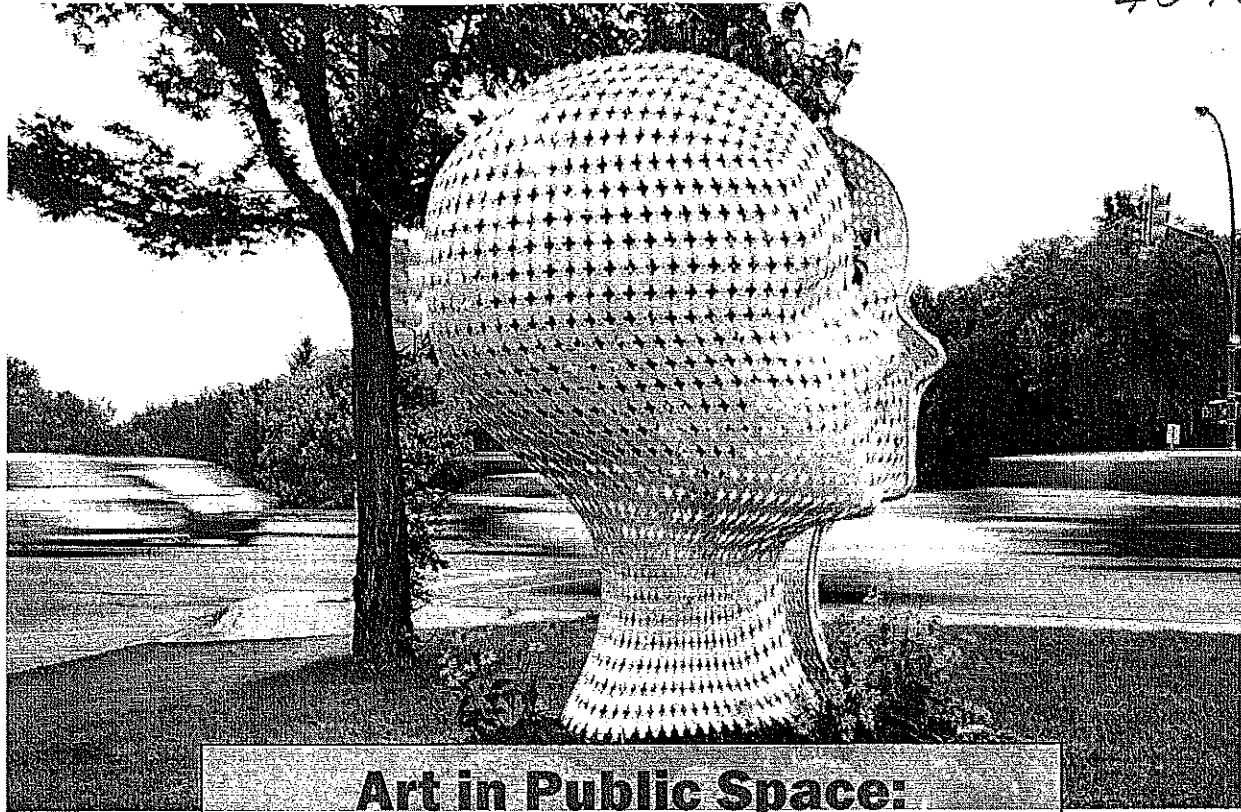

**Art in Public Space:  
Who Owns It? Who Decides?  
A Moderated Discussion**

Urban development and shifting demographics are altering the public space of Saskatoon. Cultural events and public art are active participants in changing the face of Saskatoon's public space. Nuit Blanche Saskatoon, Parking Days, the City's Art Placement program and billboard public art projects activate and animate the streets, attracting varying and often younger audiences, and providing new interactions between presenters and audiences.
