ZONING NOTICE

Proposed Zoning Bylaw – Bylaw 9990

Saskatoon City Council will consider Bylaw No. 9990, Zoning Bylaw, 2024. The purpose of this Bylaw is to adopt a new Zoning Bylaw for the City of Saskatoon and repeal Bylaw No. 8770, Zoning Bylaw, 2009.

The City of Saskatoon has undertaken a comprehensive review of the Zoning Bylaw to align it with identified strategic priorities, current trends, and changes to provincial legislation. Over the past three years City Council has considered eleven amendment packages which contained substantive changes to the Zoning Bylaw. These amendments covered several topics and included amendments to most sections of the Bylaw. Detailed Information on the amendments made can be found at saskatoon.ca/zoningbylaw.

Bylaw No. 9990 is a consolidated version of the existing Zoning Bylaw up to and including those amendments considered at the Public Hearing meeting of City Council held on July 31, 2024.

Bylaw No. 9990 includes following changes:

- Updated references to other Civic Departments and Divisions, City bylaws and policies, and Federal and Provincial legislation;
- Amendments for clarity and consistency including spelling, grammar and punctuation;
- Updated Appendixes with current information and figures;
- Updated and standardized figures and new figures required for bylaw clarification;
- Formatting changes including ordering of the sections of the bylaw; and
- Organization within sections for easier readability.

NEEDLES & SHARPS

If you find a needle, follow these steps:

- Do not recap the needle.
- Wear garden, work or medical gloves.
- Use tweezers, pliers or tongs to pick up the needle by the end that is not the sharp end. Keep away from your body.
- Place the needle, sharp end first, into a hard container that needles cannot poke through (e.g. liquid laundry detergent or bleach container).
- Fill a container no more than 3/4 full. If a container is too full, the needles may poke through the side.
- Put the container lid on tightly and tape it.
- Wash your hands with soap and water.
- Store the container in a safe place away from children until you can dispose of it safely.
- Do not place needles in city garbage or recycling.
- Place in a needle drop box in your community.

REPLACE SMOKE ALARMS EVERY 10 YEARS

Smoke alarms do not last forever. Check the manufacture date on your smoke alarms. If the alarms are 10 years old or older, replace them with new alarms.

To keep your smoke alarms in good working order, they need to:

- Be tested at least every three months
- Have the batteries replaced yearly or when the detector is chirping
- Be replaced every 10 years, even if they are hard-wired
