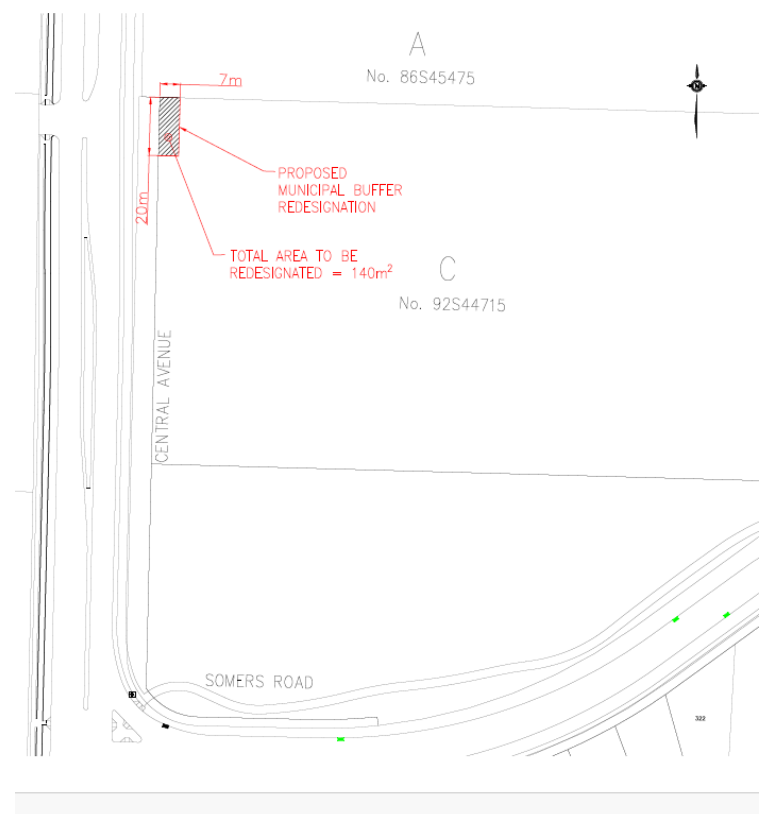
Proposed Municipal Buffer Redesignation and Sale – adjacent to Central Avenue

The City of Saskatoon is proposing the following Municipal Buffer redesignation and sale – near intersection of Somers Road and Central Avenue – Silverspring Neighbourhood

BACKGROUND

At the June 28, 2023 Regular Meeting of City Council, Council approved the sale of land from the City of Saskatoon to SaskEnergy Incorporated for \$12,300.00 for the building of a district regulator station. SaskEnergy Incorporated provides natural gas to customers in Saskatoon and an expansion of their infrastructure is required to continue serving their customers. A condition in the sale agreement between the City of Saskatoon and SaskEnergy Incorporated is the closure and redesignation of a portion of the Municipal Buffer that will allow driveway access to this portion of land. This is required to meet the City’s subdivision requirements as parcels must have direct access to a legally subdivided roadway for access requirements.

Location: Adjacent to Central Avenue approximately 215 meters north of the intersection of Somers Road and Central Avenue
