## CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS SAVE LIVES

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odourless, colourless, tasteless, deadly gas. Elevated levels of carbon monoxide can cause illness or death before people even know it is there.

A carbon monoxide alarm will alert you if dangerous levels of carbon monoxide are accumulating. Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed outside each sleeping area and are most effective when interconnected throughout your home.

If your carbon monoxide alarm sounds or you suspect carbon monoxide in your home, immediately move to a location with fresh air and call 9-1-1. For more information, visit saskatoon.ca/fire.

**NEEDLES & SHARPS** 

If you find a needle, follow these steps:

- Do not recap the needle.
- Wear garden, work or medical gloves.
- Use tweezers, pliers or tongs to pick up the needle by the end that is not the sharp end. Keep away from your body.
- Place the needle, sharp end first, into a hard container that needles cannot poke through (e.g. liquid laundry detergent or bleachcontainer).
- Fill a container no more than 3/4 full If a container is too full, the needles may poke through the side.
- Put the container lid on tightly and tape it.
- Wash your hands with soap and water.
- Store the container in a safe place away from children until you can dispose of it safely.
- Do not place needles in city garbage or recycling.
- Place in a needle drop box in your community.

# **REPLACE SMOKE ALARMS EVERY 10 YEARS**

Smoke alarms do not last forever. Check the manufacture date on your smoke alarms. If the alarms are 10 years old or older, replace them with new alarms. To keep your smoke alarms in good working order, they need to:

- Be tested at least every three months
- Have the batteries replace yearly or when the detector is chirping
- Be replaced every 10 years, even if they are hard-wired
