

In Canada, we have three orders or levels of government that Canadian citizens elect political representatives for: municipal, provincial and federal. Each level has different responsibilities, and they are often shared across levels of government as they work together.

When it comes to defining the responsibilities held by each level of government, there can be confusion about which level is accountable for an area's administration and decision-making.

Elections Saskatoon is the City of Saskatoon's non-partisan independent election-management body and office responsible for directing and supervising the successful administration of Saskatoon's **2024 Civic Election** as scheduled by legislation on **November 13, 2024**.

Elections Saskatoon's commitment will:

- provide for a modernized, transparent, fair, and well-run 2024 civic election
- protect the integrity of the voting process
- have processes in place to provide for a faster and more efficient, accessible and improved voter experience at the polls
- have the people and technology in place to support homebound, people experiencing homelessness or persons with disability who are eligible to vote for their local government
- support diversity and inclusion in the election process
- provide alternate voting method options to help eliminate barriers to voting so that every eligible voter has the opportunity to vote in the 2024 Civic Election

Elections Saskatoon has added new technology, voting method options and other voter enhancements for 2024

Saskatoon has continued to grow, technology has changed and continues to improve, and the voting public expect more voting options. Elections Saskatoon is committed to supporting a modernized civic election through election best practices and legislation.

USE OF AN ELECTRONIC VOTERS LIST

Elections Saskatoon has adopted the use of an electronic Voters List in this election for the ease of voting and to help provide a faster, more efficient experience for voters who have pre-registered.

The Voters List provides an effective way to confirm/verify a voter's identity. Use of a Voters List enables Elections Saskatoon to update the voting record and it serves to protect the integrity of the voting process by ensuring only eligible voters are given access to a ballot and are only able to vote one time.

The 2024 Voters List was compiled from data provided by **Elections Saskatchewan** in partnership with **Elections Saskatoon** to conduct the 2024 Civic Election. Residents were encouraged to visit the Election Saskatoon website before October 22, 2024, email, phone or visit in person to update their information or confirm that it was correct.

Voters List: Important To Know

If you did not get a chance to register for the Voters List before October 22, 2024, not to worry. You will fill out your Voter Registration Form at the polling location you attend.

Here is what will happen at the voting location you attend with respect to the Voters List:

- When you go to your polling place with acceptable ID and present it to the Poll Official, they will confirm if your name is on the Voters List.
- If your name is not on the Voters List, the Poll Official will ask you to fill out a Voter Registration Form and you will be issued your ballot.
- If your name is on the Voters List, the Poll Official will confirm your eligibility and school support and issue your ballot.
- This will be the process at all polling places, Advance Polls, Drive-Thru Voting and on Election Day.

Who Can Vote In Saskatoon's 2024 Civic Election?

You are eligible to vote if you meet the following criteria as of November 13, 2024:

- a. you are a Canadian citizen and at least 18 years old on the day of the election; and
- b. you have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding election day; and
- c. you are a resident of Saskatoon, **or** you have owned **assessable land*** within the municipality <u>for at least three consecutive months</u> immediately preceding election day.

Do you own assessable land in more than one ward in which you do not reside?

If so, you are eligible to vote only in the ward in which the total assessment of the voter's land is highest. Contact the Assessment Office at **assessmentsubmit@saskatoon.ca** or call **306-975-3227** to request a certificate. You must present the certificate to the Elections Saskatoon official when registering to vote at the polling place you attend.

If you are a resident of Saskatoon and eligible to vote, you also vote for either the public school board trustee or the separate school board trustee (if you are of the Catholic faith). You will receive a ballot with the school board trustee candidates for the school division you support.

Voting for a Saskatoon Catholic School Board Trustee?

You must be of the Catholic faith which includes any Catholic rite, such as Roman, Ukrainian, Chaldean, etc. that recognizes The Pope as leader of the church. If you live outside of Saskatoon but are the owner of assessable land in Saskatoon, you are eligible to vote for mayor and ward councillor only.





ELECTION DAY: Wednesday, November 13, 2024 All polls on Election Day will be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

What ID do I need to vote?

All voters must provide identification (ID) which shows their name and current address.

When you go to vote at a polling place, you must bring identification.



Here are your ID options:

Option 1: (Your Best Option)

- One piece of identification that includes your photo and current address issued by a federal, provincial, or municipal government.
- Your Saskatchewan driver's license or Saskatchewan photo ID card (for non-drivers) is sufficient and all you need, if your address is current.
- Option 1A: If you have registered for the Voters List, also bring along your 6-digit Voter ID number.

Helpful Tip: If you do not have a driver's license you are able to acquire photo identification from the Saskatchewan Government Insurance company (SGI).

Option 2:

- Two pieces of information, both which must contain your name and at least one that must contain your current address. Examples include a utility bill or a credit card statement.
- Visit saskatoon.ca/vote2024 to view approximately 50 acceptable ID documents that will be acceptable for voting.

Helpful Tip: You can use your phone to prove your identity and residence by showing the election worker your bank statement, utility bill or rental/lease agreement.

Option 3: There are ways to vote even if you do not have ID

- If you do not have any form of acceptable identification another person can vouch for your identity and address. In this case, the person vouching for you must:
 - · be present with you at the polling place
 - be an eligible voter in the election
 - have acceptable identification
 - complete the prescribed form to vouch for you at the polling place

Vote your way

You have several voting method options to make your voting plan easy and accessible.

Vote by Mail-in Ballot

All eligible voters can apply for a mail-in ballot kit to conveniently cast your vote by mail.

Eligible voters, apply for your mail-in ballot kit through a few options:

- > Online at saskatoon.ca/votebymail no later than 5 p.m. October 31, 2024
- **Email:** Complete your mail-in ballot **application form** with your ID documents and return via **email** to **elections@saskatoon.ca** no later than 5 p.m. October 31, 2024
- ➤ Mail: Send your mail-in ballot application form with your ID documents (download from saskatoon.ca/votebymail) by regular mail to the Elections Saskatoon Office at 200-145 1st Ave N, Saskatoon SK, S7K 1W6 no later than 5 p.m. October 31, 2024
- ➤ In person: Deliver your application form with your ID documents to the Elections Saskatoon
 Office at 200-145 1st Ave N, Saskatoon SK, S7K 1W6 no later than 5 p.m. on November 12, 2024

Approved mail-in ballot applications that were received before October 15, will be mailed out the week of October 22, 2024. Approved mail-in ballot applications received after October 15 but by October 31, will be mailed out at the time of approval.

Once you have received your mail-in ballot kit, follow the instruction sheet provided in your kit. Mark your ballot and return in the prepaid voter return envelope in your kit **OR** return in person no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day of November 13, 2024.

You'll need identification to vote. Acceptable identification documents include:

- > one piece of identification issued by the Government of Canada, the Government of Saskatchewan, a municipality or a government agency that contains a photograph of the voter and his or her name and address; OR
- > any two pieces of information, each of which establishes the voter's name and at least one of which establishes the voter's address;
- > a voter can also have another eligible voter who is a friend or family member with acceptable ID documents to vouch for their identity, by filling the appropriate forms with the election official at their polling location


Voter Assistance

Voter Assist Terminals (VAT)

Voter Assist Terminals (VAT) aid voters who are visually or physically impaired, allowing them to cast their ballot independently and privately.

There are multiple ways for voters to interact and mark their ballot using the voter assist terminal devices as follows:

- Directly on the touch screen (various languages available)
- Keypad includes Braille
- Rocker Paddle Device
- Sip-N-Puff Device
- Audio Headphones

How to Find Your Voting Location on Election Day



Remember: You can vote at ANY Advance Poll location but on Election Day, November 13, 2024, you must vote at the polling station assigned to the neighbourhood in which you live, unless you choose to vote at one of the Super Polls (check bottom of this page).

Enter your street name first and then your building number into the easy-to-use poll finder at saskatoon. ca/mypoll. Your ward and Election Day polling location will be displayed.

Important: If you live in a multi-unit property, you only need to enter your building number and street name. *No need to enter your unit or apartment number.*

All ward maps and polling stations by neighbourhood are listed for you in this guide.

Check the ward where you live and the location of your polling place.

- You can choose to vote at any voting location during the 10 Advance Polls November 1 - 4, 2024.
- Any eligible voter can choose to vote at the Drive-Thru Voting at City Hall on November 9, 2024.
- On Election Day, November 13, 2024, you must vote at the polling location designated for your neighbourhood, unless you choose to vote at one of the Super Polls.

Important Information for Out-Of-Town Voters Who Own Property in Saskatoon

- If you reside outside Saskatoon but are eligible to vote for the municipal election because you own property in Saskatoon, you must vote at the poll in which the property you own is located.
- If you own more than one property in Saskatoon, you can only vote once in the ward where your highest assessable property is located.
- Please let the poll official know that you are a non-resident voter so that you will receive the appropriate "no school support" ballot.

Helpful Tip:

- Poll boundaries run down the centre of a road. If you live on one side of the road, you may vote in a different poll or ward than your neighbour across the street.
- Need transportation? Saskatoon Transit will offer free transit for voters on Election Day, November 13, 2024. Free Transit pass on back cover, or download to your phone, or print off, from saskatoon.ca/voterinfo.

- ✓ Election Day polls have been planned to have one voting location per neighbourhood where possible.
- ✓ You must attend the polling location assigned to the ward in which you live. Enter your complete address at **saskatoon.ca/mypoll** to confirm your ward and the voting location you will go to on November 13.

What if English is Your Second Language?

Elections Saskatoon is committed to removing barriers to voting.

Elections Saskatoon committed to hiring election workers who speak additional languages other than English to reflect Saskatoon's diverse community.

Ask if any Elections Saskatoon officials speak your language and watch for the special language badges they'll be wearing. You can bring your own translator to assist you in voting. Your translator will need to complete the Declaration of Interpreter form at the poll.

Here's What to Expect on Election Day

- When you arrive at your designated polling place on Election Day, an Elections Saskatoon worker will greet you and determine if you are at the correct voting place for your neighbourhood (at Advance Polls you can vote at ANY location).
- Another Elections Saskatoon official will ask you to show your identification to establish your name and address. To make the process faster, provide your 6-digit Voter ID also if you know it from pre-registering.
- You will then be marked off the Voters List as voted, and then issued your ballot in a secrecy sleeve.
- Go behind the voting screen. Mark your ballot by filling the oval space by the candidates of your choice with the pen provided.
- Insert your ballot into the secrecy sleeve used to maintain the privacy of your vote.
- Hand the secrecy sleeve to the last Elections Saskatoon official who will insert your ballot into the vote counting machine.

That's it. You will have made your vote count in the 2024 Civic Election.

Two neighbourhoods have changed wards.


In 2023, the Municipal Wards Commission established new ward boundaries. The Commission's review is a legislated requirement under *The Cities Act*, which must be undertaken every four years prior to the civic election to meet legislated population variance requirements.

The new ward boundaries take effect with the 2024 municipal and school board elections.

What does this mean?

Some neighbourhoods have changed wards. Voters, you need to know the ward you belong to, so you know which candidate to vote for. If you live in one of these wards listed below, you will vote in your new ward for the 2024 Civic Election.

Voters, enter your address at **saskatoon.ca/mypoll** to confirm the WARD you belong to and VOTING LOCATION you must attend if you are voting on Election Day, November 13, 2024.
