### **Material Definitions**

- Clean Fill Materials are defined as: inert concrete, reinforced concrete, stones, bricks, cindercrete, tile/ceramics, soil and sand that does not cause any adverse environmental impacts or any public health or safety concerns.
- 2. Mixed Fill Materials are defined as: any combination of construction and demolition wastes not acceptable as clean fill.

- 3. Hazardous Materials are defined as: materials that have high potential for harm to human health and the environment if handled or disposed of improperly.
  - Residents are required to have all hazardous materials removed as a part of the demolition process. A qualified abatement contractor must remove materials such as asbestos and fuel tanks from the site. If these materials are to be removed from your site, please attach an abatement plan listing the types and volume of hazardous material, manner in which it is to be removed, name, address and contact number of qualified abatement contractor doing the work, and the method of disposal, including disposal destination.

- 4. Materials Separated for Re-Use or Recycling
