WILDWOOD LADIES GOLF CLUB: TUESDAY LEAGUE Feb., 2025

Welcome to the Tuesday Ladies League at Wildwood Golf Course.We have three sections:

- Morning 18 Holes
- Morning 9 Holes
- Evening 9 Holes (starting at 4:00 p.m.)

When registering with the league, you must choose a particular section for the current year. You are welcome to change to another section in subsequent years.

Club fees are used to register all league members with Golf Canada and Golf Saskatchewan. See <u>golfcanada.ca</u> for all benefits of membership. Club fees are also used to fund general meetings and weekly games, as well as to support competitions planned for the golf season.

Responsibilities of <u>Executive</u> Committee to General Membership:

- Maintain memberships for all players with Golf Canada and Golf Saskatchewan.
- Work with Club Pro at Wildwood Course to book regular Tee Times for league play.
- Organize Annual and Semi Annual general meetings.
- Provide Rules Clinics when number of potential registrants warrants.
- Provide subsidized golf lessons, availability permitting.
- Provide organized weekly games for each section and allocate prizes.
- Organize yearly Club Championship and Shot Gun Start Competitions, number of registrants permitting. Also organize Ada MacKenzie and Canada Day Competitions.
- Uphold the League Constitution and Bylaws.
- Encourage member participation in all league events.

Executive Committee Members are <u>volunteers</u> who strive to provide league members with a well organized golf experience that is friendly and enjoyable.

Responsibilities of <u>General Members</u> to League:

Book weekly tee times using Google Sheets. You can book one other golfer to your time slot.

If unable to attend the day of, it is <u>imperative</u> that you call Wildwood (306) 975-3320 ASAP to cancel. Failure to do so could jeopardize the number of tee times our league is allocated in future years!

Arrive 20 minutes before tee time: check in at clubhouse and be at Tee Box on time.

Be familiar with, and abide by, the Rules of Golf. See <u>golfcanada.ca</u> for an excellent review.

Handicap Index: Members are *strongly encouraged* to establish and maintain a handicap index (i.e., a rating of golf ability/performance). To do so, input your scores, hole by hole, on the Golf Canada web site. The site automatically adjusts scores as appropriate. Scores for 5 rounds of 18 holes, or 10 rounds of 9 holes, are needed to <u>establish</u> a handicap index. Please input scores regularly to maintain a <u>current</u> handicap index for weekly games and scheduled competitions.

Score Cards: Members are *encouraged* to keep a score card for each day of league play:

- Card must be signed (player's full name) and attested (initial and last name of fellow player).
- Cards to be remitted to specified <u>Section's Box</u> each week to be eligible for prizes.

Scoring Rules for Wildwood Ladies League: a few highlites to ensure fairness/equity For all players who enter scores to establish a handicap index with Golf Canada **and** for all those who <u>submit cards for weekly prizes</u>, as well as for other competitions:

- no <u>mulligans (i.e.</u>, no do overs on the tee box for a poor drive).
- no gimmies (i.e., no having a short putt conceded as made). You must putt out on each hole.
- a whiff (i.e., a swing and miss) is counted as a stroke.
- a lost ball is "2" penalty strokes.

Etiquette of Golf: please be welcoming and thoughtful.

- Refrain from talking, moving, or being in the sight line of another player while she is in the midst of hitting or putting.
- Mark your ball on Green as needed, for others to putt without impedence/distraction.
- Do not step on another player's line of putt, without the permission of that player.

Speed of Play: Keep up with the group in front of you. To do so, consider the following:

- Who ever is <u>ready</u> to tee up, does so.
- Go to your ball as soon as it is safe to do so and be <u>ready</u> to play.
- If someone is slightly behind you and is not ready, hit your ball. Then move safely to the side.
- Think about your shot and/or putt before it's your turn.
- Do not look for a lost ball for more than **3** minutes.
- If it will speed up play, consider assisting another in raking bunkers and moving clubs.
- Mark your score card on the <u>next Tee Box</u>, NOT on, or near, the green of hole just played.

Respect the Golf Course:

- Rake bunkers.
- Replace divots on fairways and repair depressions (i.e., ball marks) on greens.
- Keep all carts off Tee Boxes and Greens
- Tee up between Markers. You can extend 2 club lengths back from markers, but not forward.

League Competitions: Score cards must be submitted to participate.

- 1. Ada MacKenzie: \$2.00 to play with proceeds to support Junior Golf (First Tee).
- 2. <u>Canada Day</u>: \$2.00 to play with proceeds to support Junior Golf (First Tee).
- 3. <u>Shot Gun Start</u>: groups of four tee off simultaneously from different holes on the course with all participants finishing at approximately the same time. Social time follows.

4. <u>Club Championship</u>: 2 day tournament in August. Open to ALL without restriction. All you need is to be a member and have an <u>established</u> and <u>current</u> handicap.

- Champion and runner up determined from the field using 2 days gross (i.e., actual) scores.
- A prize is also allocated for low net score, (i.e., actual score minus handicap) for entire field.
- All other parts of competition are flighted by handicap so each participant competes against others of similar skill level. Prizes are awarded for low gross and low net scores in each flight.

Birdies, Chip Ins, Etc.: There are sheets on the Tuesday Ladies Notice Board in Clubhouse for Birdies (1 under par), Chip ins (holing ball from off green), Holes-in-One, Albatrosses (3 under) and Eagles (2 under). Sign the appropriate sheet and have it attested by a fellow player.
